Martin, Frances Conroy, Jeffrey Wright, David Schramm, Harriet Harris, David Ogden Stiers, Hamish Linklater, Lisa Banes, Mary Lou Rosato, and Keith David. Its celebrated education programs—master classes, workshops, and Learning Through Theater artistic residencies—reach over 37,000 students yearly, particularly those with no other access to arts education and live performances.

Our 2013-14 season starts with a fall tour of William Shakespeare's Hamlet, directed by The Acting Company's artistic director Ian Belknap. During the winter and spring, Hamlet will run in repertory with Tom Stoppard's *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern Are Dead*, both productions in association with the Guthrie Theater. TONY winner John Rando (Broadway's Urinetown, Lincoln Center's Carousel) will direct, as he did Trevor Nunn's *Comedy of Errors* in 2001. The company will tour to 42 cities and towns in 15 states across the country. While on tour, the company presents master classes, student matinees, and one-hour, performance-based workshops of Shakespeare for younger audiences.

We are currently commissioning a new work based on Tennessee Williams' short stories featuring Acting Company alumni actors that will be directed by Michael Wilson. Playwrights include John Guare, Rebecca Gilman, Beth Henley, Marcus Gardley, David Grimm, and Elizabeth Egloff.

The Acting Company is a TONY Honoree for Excellence in Theater and has also won the Obie Award, the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle Award, Citibank's Excellence in Education Award, and two Audelco Awards.

Darien Battle was in Fallujah (NYC Culture Project); Be the Death of Me (The Civilians); His Girl Friday and Going Live! (Guthrie Theater); Merchant of Venice and Social Creatures (Trinity Rep); Cyrano De Bergerac; Ragtime; Antigone; and Richard III (Ten Thousand Things). Battle is a Ten Thousand Things Core Acting Member and a Midwest Regional Emmy Award winner. A native of Minneapolis, Battle received his master's degree of fine arts from Brown University/Trinity Reperatory Company.

Ernest Bentley is an Acting Company alum (*Julius Caesar, Comedy of Errors*). Bentley's credit highlights include *The Burial at Thebes, Appomattox* (Guthrie Theater), and *Anne & Emmett* reading with Anna Deveare Smith. Bentley, from Detroit, received his bachelor's degree of fine arts from the University of Minnesota and completed the Guthrie Theater Actor Training Program.

Jacqueline Correa has appeared regionally in Macbeth (PSF), Confluence (Guthrie), and On the Verge (CATF), and has also appeared in Six Characters in Search of an Author, Picasso at Lapin, Agile, Shakespeare's Women, Tartuffe, Three Sisters, Heartbreak House, The Rivals, Much Ado, A Flea in Her Ear, and Peter Pan. A native of Manhattan Beach, Calif., Correa received her master's degree of fine arts from the Professional Theatre Training Program at the University of Delaware.

Ian Gould has appeared at the Great Lakes Theater (Cleveland), Lake Tahoe and Idaho Shakespeare Festivals, Pearl Theatre Company (New York), Centerstage (Baltimore), New Harmony Theater (Indiana), Luna Stage (New Jersey) and Metro Stage (Virginia). Gould has appeared in *The Jew of Malta* and *The Sandman*. A native of Pittsburgh, Gould received his master's degree of fine arts from The Shakespeare Theatre Company Academy for Classical Acting.

Robert David Grant appeared off Broadway in *The Great Recession* and *The Footage* (Flea Theater). Regionally, Grant has performed in *Hamlet* (Yale Reperatory Theatre); *Henry IV Part 1* and *Hamlet* (The Shakespeare Theatre of New Jersey); and *Rey Planta* and *Christie in Love* (Yale Cabaret). Grant has also appeared in *Sunday in the Park with George, Angels in America,* and *Julius Caesar.* A native of Vershire, Vt., Grant has a master's degree of fine arts from Yale School of Drama.

Angela Janas appeared in *Romeo and Juliet, The Three Musketeers, King Lear* (Hudson Valley Shakespeare Festival), *In Game or Real* (Guthrie Studio), *Arcadia* (Nevada Conservatory Theatre), and *Triumph of Love* (Minnesota Centennial Showboat). A native of Lino Lakes, Minn., Janas received her bachelor's degree of fine arts from the University of Minnesota/Guthrie Theatre Actor Training Program.

Joshua Johnston has appeared in *Passion* (Lincoln Center Theater and PBS), *Can-Can* (New York City Center Encores!), *Annie Get Your Gun, A Little Night Music, Anyone Can Whistle,* and *Sunday in the Park with George* (Ravinia Festival). A graduate of Ithaca College, where he received his bachelor's degree of fine arts, Johnston is a native of Kent, Conn.

Suzy Kohane has been in *The Primrose Path* (Guthrie), *Company* (Theater Latte Da), *The Legend of Sleepy Hollow* (Walking Shadow), *As You Like It* (Public Theater of Minn.), *Twelfth Night* (The Strange Capers), and *The Cosmic Equation* (TigerLion Arts). A native of Columbus, Ohio, Kohane received her bachelor's degree of fine arts from the University of Minnesota/Guthrie Actor Training Program.

Patrick Lane appeared in New York in *Colette Collage* (York Theater). Regionally, Lane has appeared in *Once in a Lifetime*, Armistead Maupin's *Tales of the City*, A *Christmas Carol*, and *Scapin* with Bill Irwin (A.C.T.), as well as *Romeo and Juliet* (California Shakespeare Theater). A native of Louisville, Ky., Lane received his bachelor's degree of fine arts from the University of Evansville and his master's degree of fine arts from American Conservatory Theater.

Andy Nogasky appeared in *Love Song of an Albanian Sous Chef* (Ensemble Studio Theatre), *Trevor* (Lesser America) in New York. Regionally, Nogasky has appeared in *All My Sons* (Barrington Stage), *Twelve Angry Men* (George Street), *Raisin in the Sun* (Actors Theatre of Louisville), and *Two Rooms* and *Cliffhanger* (Winnipesaukee Playhouse). A native of Greensburg, Pa., Nogasky received his master's degree of fine arts from Rutgers Mason Gross School of the Arts.

Grant Fletcher Prewitt has appeared in *Billy Bishop Goes to War, Oh What A Lovely War* (KCAT); *Brighton Beach Memoirs* (Black Hills Playhouse); *Christmas Carol* (Kansas City Repertory); *With Their Eyes* and *Once Upon A Mattress* (Coterie Theatre); and *Head* (Kansas City Fringe). Grant holds a master's degree of fine arts from University of Missouri-Kansas City and hails from Kansas City, Mo.

John Skelley is an Acting Company alum, having appeared in Comedy of Errors and Romeo and Juliet. Skelley also appeared in Long Day's Journey into Night, Tales from Hollywood, Roman Holiday, Hay Fever, Charley's Aunt, Macbeth, A Christmas Carol, The Importance of Being Earnest, Two Gentlemen of Verona, View from the Bridge, Midsummer Night's Dream, and Jane Eyre (Guthrie). He also appeared in the film Into Temptation. Originally from Eden Prairie, Minn., Skelley received his bachelor's degree of fine arts from the University of Minnesota/Guthrie Theater Actor Training Program.

ARTISTIC and PRODUCTION

William Shakespeare (playwright), an English poet and playwright (1564-1616), is widely regarded as the greatest writer of the English language. He wrote 38 plays, hundreds of poems and sonnets, and created words and phrases still popular today. His plays range from tragedies like *Hamlet* and *Romeo and Juliet* to comedies like *A Midsummer Night's Dream* and *Twelfth Night* and history plays like *Richard III* and *Henry V*. Even today, Shakespeare is the most performed playwright in the U.S.

Sir Tom Stoppard (playwright) has written prolifically for TV, radio, film, and stage, finding prominence with plays such as *Arcadia*, *The Coast of Utopia*, *Every Good Boy Deserves Favour*, *Professional Foul*, *The Real Thing*, and *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern Are Dead*. He's won an Academy Award for *Shakespeare in Love*, as well as four TONY Awards. Exploration of linguistics and philosophy pervade his work, and he is one of the most internationally performed dramatists of his generation.

Ian Belknap (director, *Hamlet*) is artistic director of The Acting Company, where he has previously directed national tours of *The Comedy of Errors* and *Of Mice and Men*. He most recently helmed New York productions of *Twelfth Night* and *Damascus*. Belknap has associate produced five national tours for The Acting Company in association with the Guthrie Theater, is a guest director at New York University, acts as a site evaluator for Pew Center for Arts and Heritage, and recently received an honorary alumnus award from Towson University, where he graduated summa cum laude.

John Rando (director, Rosencrantz and Guildenstern Are Dead) has worked on Broadway on productions of Urinetown, The Musical (TONY and Outer Critic's Circle Awards), A Christmas Story, Wedding Singer, Thousand Clowns, Neil Simon's Dinner Party, and Lincoln Center's Carousel. Rando has recently worked for New York City Center Encores! on Gentlemen Prefer Blondes and It's A Bird.... Off-Broadway credits include Toxic Avenger Musical (OCC Award), Pig Farm, All In The Timing, Mere Mortals, and The Acting Company's Comedy Of Errors. He's directed at many regional theatres; was named a Drama League Directing Fellow; and received the Distinguished Alumni Award from the UCLA School of Theater, Film, and Television, and the Outstanding Young Texas Ex Award from the University of Texas.

Neil Patel (set design) has worked with The Acting Company on Of Mice and Men, Julius Caesar, The Comedy of Errors, Romeo and Juliet, The Heart Is A Lonely Hunter, Jane Eyre, Moby Dick, The Tempest, The Spy, and Henry V. Patel is an award-winning set designer working on and off Broadway, with major opera companies, and at most resident theatres across the country.

Candice Donnelly (costume design) has worked with The Acting Company on *Of Mice and Men, Julius Caesar, Comedy of Errors,* and *Love's Fire.* Broadway credits include *Our Country's Good, Fences, Hughie, Search and Destroy,* and *Mastergate.* Donnelly has also worked with several off-Broadway and regional companies, including BAM, Public, Roundabout, New York City Opera, ACT San Francisco, Centerstage Baltimore, Guthrie, Williamstown, Alley, Berkley, and American Rep. Donnelly attended Yale School of Drama and has also worked extensively in film and TV.

Greg Goff (lighting design) has worked for the Williamstown Theatre Festival, Spoleto Festival USA, The Kennedy Center, New Jersey Performing Arts Center, New York Stage and Film, TheaterWorks Hartford, Yale University, Boise Contemporary Theater, Perseverance Theater (Douglas, Ark.), and Summer Repertory Theater (Santa Rosa, Calif.). World tours include Nelly Furtado, GirlTalk, Patricia Norowol Dance, and Jody Oberfelder Dance Projects. Goff received his master's degree of fine arts from New York University.

Michael Kiley (music and sound design) is a Philadelphia-based sound designer, composer, performer, and educator working in theatre and dance. Theatre credits include As You Like It (The Acting Company), The Aliens, Ivona-Princess of Burgindia, That Pretty Pretty, and Blasted. Dance credits include Return Return Departure, Takes, Wandering Alice, and Only Sleeping. Kiley's original work includes As the Eyes of the Seahorse (HERE Arts Center) and The Empty Air.

Elizabeth Smith (voice and speech consultant) has worked in New York on Macbeth, No Man's Land, Waiting for Godot, Comedy of Errors, Mrs. Warren's Profession, Importance of Being Earnest, Cymbeline, Coast of Utopia, Rivals, Henry IV, Invention of Love, Ivanov, Arcadia, Homecoming, Dirty Rotten Scoundrels, Tommy, My Fair Lady, Beauty and the Beast, Me and My Girl, and Dracula. Regionally, Smith has worked with Shakespeare Theatre, D.C.; Long Wharf Theatre; ART; Hartford; Centre and Arena Stage; Guthrie; and Glimmerglass. Smith has worked with The Acting Company since 1972. In 1996, Smith received the John Houseman Award.

Felix Ivanoff (fight director) has worked with the Acting Company on *Comedy of Errors, Romeo and Juliet, Moby Dick Rehearsed, Macbeth,* and *Three Musketeers.* An actor, director, and choreographer, Ivanoff taught at Moscow Art Theatre and Holland's Academy of Fine Arts. An assistant professor at Syracuse University's Drama School, he has taught at Juilliard, SUNY-Purchase, Rutgers, Manhattanville and North Carolina School of the Arts. Ivanoff received his master's degree of fine arts in acting from Moscow's Vakhtangov School of Drama.

Devin Brain (staff repertory director) is a graduate of the Yale School of Drama and a member of The Hypocrites. Brain returns to The Acting Company and served as artistic director of both the Yale Cabaret and Yale Summer Cabaret Shakespeare Festival. Credits include *Rose Mark'd* (an adaptation of *Henry V, Henry VI parts 1-3*, and *Richard III*), The 4th Graders Present an Unnamed Love Suicide, and The Phoenix.

Gina Noele Odierno (production stage manager) has worked previously at The Acting Company, Yale Repertory, California Theatre Center, Carnival Cruise Lines, and Second Stage Theatre. She earned her master's degree of fine arts from the Yale School of Drama, and her bachelor's degree of fine arts from Florida State University School of Theatre.

Brandon Curtis (assistant stage manager) has worked on *Of Mice and Men* and *As You Like It* (Acting Company); A Doctor in Spite of Himself (Yale Rep, SM); I <3 Bob (Parallel Exit, SM); Bossa Nova (Yale Rep, ASM); and North (59E59, ASM). Curtis received his master's degree of fine arts in stage management from Yale School of Drama and his bachelor's degree in theatre from The Ohio State University.

McCorkle Casting, LTD. (casting) has worked on Broadway for Lieutenant of Inishmore, Cat On A Hot Tin Roof, Doll's House, and Blood Brothers. Off-Broadway credits include Almost Maine, Address Unknown, and Killer Joe. Film credits include Ghost Town, Secret Window, Basic, Thomas Crown Affair, 13th Warrior, Madeline, and School Ties. TV credits include Electric Company, 3lbs., Barbershop, Chappelle's Show, and Hack.

Joe Dowling (director, Guthrie Theater) has directed more than 35 productions at the Guthrie since 1995, including landmark productions of Shakespeare, Chekhov, Stoppard, and Friel. Under Dowling's leadership, the Guthrie has enjoyed tremendous growth, including the 2006 opening of a new Guthrie on the banks of the Mississippi River. Dowling has been artistic director of Ireland's Abbey Theatre and managing/artistic director of Dublin's Gaiety Theatre. His American work includes numerous productions in New York and Washington, D.C.

Margot Harley (producer, The Acting Company) co-founded The Acting Company with John Houseman. Productions on-Broadway and off include *Robber Bridegroom*, *Curse of an Aching Heart, The Cradle Will Rock* (also London), *Ten by Tennessee, On the Verge,* and *The Heart Is A Lonely Hunter* with New York Theatre Workshop. Harley worked as administrator of Juilliard's Drama Division from 1968-1980, she graduated from Sarah Lawrence College, and attended London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art on a Fulbright Scholarship.

The Guthrie Theater is one of America's leading regional theatres and is widely recognized as an American center for theatre performance, production, and professional training. Headed by Joe Dowling, director, the Guthrie has built one of the finest multistage theatre centers of our time, including a classic thrust for grand scale classics, a proscenium for more intimate productions, and a studio for developing new works. In 1982, the Guthrie received a TONY Award acknowledging its outstanding contribution to the American Theater.

The Acting Company Hundreds of extraordinary actors–Kevin Kline, Patti LuPone, Rainn Wilson, Jesse L. Martin, Frances Conroy, David Ogden Stiers, Harriet Harris, David Schramm, Jeffrey Wright, Keith David, Roslyn Ruff, Stephen DeRosa, Tom Hewitt, Randle Mell, Mary Lou Rosato, Mary Joan Negro, Lisa Banes, and Hamish Linklater–began their careers touring with The Acting Company, which has brought 138 productions to millions of people in 48 states and 10 foreign countries. Last year, the company reached 70,000 people touring to 48 cities in 20 states and provided a full range of arts education programs to 37,000 students, most in disadvantaged school systems. Founded in 1972 by Oscar-winning actor, director, and producer John Houseman and current producer Margot Harley, The Acting Company has been honored with TONY, Obie, Audelco, and Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle Awards.

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
