SLIDES, REELS: BALLYDESMOND SLIDE (TRADITIONAL) PADDY CRONIN'S (TRADITIONAL) JOHN DOHERTY'S (TRADITIONAL) SCOTT'S FAVOURITE (TRADITIONAL) Traditional arrangement by Danú

A meeting of two very different regional styles from two musical counties, Kerry and Donegal!

SONG: TÁIMSE AGUS MÁIRE (TRADITIONAL) Traditional arrangement by Danú

This great song in the Irish Language comes from the Ballyvourney Area in County Cork.

JIGS: THE NEW HOUSE (PADDY O'BRIEN) BROWN-EYED BRIDGET (OISÍN MCAULEY) THE HUMOURS OF HOLLISTON (OISÍN MCAULEY) Arrangement by Danú

The first jig of this set is composed by the great accordion player Paddy O'Brien from Nenagh, County Tipperary. Our own Oisín McAuley composed the second and third jigs.

SONG:

WILLY CROTTY (ROBBIE O'CONNELL) Arrangement by Danú

A new ballad written by Dónal Clancy's cousin, Robbie O'Connell, about the legendary Waterford outlaw, Willie Crotty, who lived in the 18th century and was a Robin Hood type, stealing from the rich to give to the poor.

REELS: MERLE'S TUNE (LIZ CARROLL) MURTOUGH MOLLOY (TRADITIONAL) THE FLAGS OF DUBLIN (TRADITIONAL) Arrangement by Danú

The first reel of this set was composed by the great Chicago fiddle player, Liz Carroll; we heard it played by Paddy O'Brien from County Offaly on his solo album, *Stranger at the Gate*. We found *Murtough Molloy* in Martin O'Neill's collection of Irish Music. The last reel, *The Flags of Dublin*, is a tune associated with the legendary piper, Séamus Ennis.

WALTZ, MARCH: CAISLEÁN RATHANÁIN (OISÍN MCAULEY) MAIRSEÁIL NA CONRACH (DÓNAL CLANCY) Arrangement by Danú

Two tunes that were composed by Oisín McAuley and Dónal Clancy after a lovely week's rehearsal in West Kerry last May. It seems the place inspired them!

SONG: FOGGY DEW (CANON CHARLES O'NEILL) Arrangement by Danú

The year 2016 is a very big commemoration year in Ireland. Ireland marks 100 years since the 1916 Easter Rising, a famous event where Irish Nationalists staged a rebellion against the English, seizing some of the major buildings in Dublin, including the General Post Office. *The Foggy Dew* was written in 1919 and is one of the great songs about this event.

SONG: PASSAGE WEST (JOHN SPILLANE) Arrangement by Danú/D. Lunny

A poignant song from the great Bard of Cork.

HORNPIPE, REELS: TUAMGRANEY CASTLE (TRADITIONAL) THE BROKEN PLEDGE (TRADITIONAL) THE BRAES OF BUSBY (TRADITIONAL) Arrangement by Danú

The hornpipe *Tuamgraney Castle* is from East Clare. This unusual version of *The Broken Pledge* came from master piper Liam O'Flynn. We heard this particular version of *The Braes of Busby* from the playing of another great piper, Ronan Browne.

SONG:

MO GHILE MEAR (SEÁN CLÁRACH AND MAC DOMHNAILL) Arrangement by Danú

Another great song in the Irish language. This lament was written in 18th century and was composed in the convention of Aisling poetry.

About Danú

Hailing from historic Counties Waterford, Cork, Donegal, and Dublin, Danú is one of the leading traditional Irish ensembles of today. Their standing room-only concerts throughout Ireland are true events featuring highenergy performances and a glorious mix of ancient Irish music and new repertoire.

For over two decades, Danú's virtuosi players on flute, tin whistle, fiddle, button accordion, bouzouki, and vocals (Irish and English) have performed around the globe and recorded seven critically acclaimed albums. Their live DVD, *One Night Stand*, was filmed at Vicar St. Dublin. Winners of numerous awards from the BBC and *Irish Music Magazine*, Danú has toured throughout Europe, the Middle East, and North America with stops at The Hollywood Bowl in Los Angeles, Symphony Space in New York City, and major concert engagements in the United Kingdom, India, Israel, and across Europe. Danú takes its audiences on a musical journey to their native Ireland, offering a moving and memorable concert experience. Danú's popular recordings are available on the Shanachie label, and live performances are often broadcast on NPR, the CBC, and the BBC.
